I would also like to personally thank Sam, Sharon, Kaz and Marilyn for their input into articles for this edition.



Fund raising Update

Our fund raising committee has been hard at work behind the scenes applying for grants and funding. We have been successful in having a locality grant approved by the SJ Shire towards the installation of a bore and to connect a pump. The bore is already down and we are awaiting delivery of our pump and electrician to connect it.

A grant has been lodged with the Department of Local Government and Communities to purchase and install a rain water tank and guttering for the church building roof.

With these important additions to the community garden, we will be self-sufficient in all our water requirements and will no longer be using our valuable drinking water on the gardens.

Next year's fund raising is aimed at refurbishing the interior of the church building and the car park.

The job of pulling up the wooden floorboards and de-nailing them was the first stage. Carol was one who put in long hours with a hammer on this task. Next came the removal of the old stumps and then replacing them with new ones. Super Steve mostly did this on his own and he was a real Trojan. Insulation was then laid under the boards to improve noise and temperature inside. Re- laying the floor was also done by our Garden Manager Steve Marsden. Lastly the original carpet was put back down to finish the job. Once the floor was finished the big clean up and furniture replacement was undertaken by enthusiastic volunteers. It must also be noted that our behind the scenes whirlwind, Kaz Rupert spent hours co-ordinating and organising this project. The fund raising by the committee headed by Marilyn Marsden have done a wonderful job of bringing in the money without which none of this would be possible. 
FROM GARDEN GATE TO DINNER PLATE
