

Resilience, this was the topic for the speaker, promoted and sponsored by the Serpentine Jarrahdale Library Friends in conjunction with Serpentine Jarrahdale Grammar School and the Golden Group for Whitby. Maggie Dent was the speaker and she held the audience captive for 2 hours.

Maggie Dent is "an author, educator and parenting and resilience specialist with a particular interest in the early years and adolescence". This event was held at the Grammar School in September. Maggie gave advice to Parents and Grandparents who attended. She suggested strategies and gave examples of ways to build resilience in children and young adults. Maggie was highly entertaining as well as informative and there were often bouts of laughter heard throughout the room. On that evening I heard young parents say "I will try that," and I heard from older parents (such as myself) "I wish I had known that before!" Such was the information and advice that was given.

This event was attended by over 250 people. It has been the largest event that the Library Friends have been involved with. It ran very smoothly thanks to the regular planning meetings held by the team coordinating the event. Considering the number of people keen to attend we hope to have Maggie Dent return here soon to speak on a different topic regarding raising children. Bendigo Bank Grant

The Serpentine Jarrahdale Library Friends is a group of dedicated volunteers who give their time and expertise to support the Mundijong Library. We assist the Library in the provision of resources, services and facilities for the benefit of the community, helping in the provision of the quality Library service which all know and appreciate.

Over the last few years the Library has been given a collection of oral history interviews done with local identities, recorded on cassette tape, which unfortunately deteriorates over time and some of the interviews were done almost 40 years ago.

So the Friends elected to administer a project to rescue some of these interviews before the valuable history and information is lost.

Our project is to digitise 57 double-sided tapes which is the first step in making the information accessible to researchers and Library clients. Future projects will be necessary to finally make these valued histories available.

The SJ Library Friends thank our partners, the SJ Community Resource Centre, and, of course, the Bendigo Bank's Community Enterprise Foundation for recognising the need for this valuable rescue work to be done.
